All submissions will be evaluated by a committee consisting of PhD students at Warwick. We are not looking for polished papers exclusively; early-stage projects are also welcome. Please find detailed submission instructions overleaf.

Submission Guidelines

Please submit an **extended abstract only**, not a complete paper.

Ensure that the document you submit does **NOT** contain your name, institution, or any other identifying information.

Please make sure to follow these **additional guidelines**:

- The extended abstract should be **no more than 3 pages** (references excluded) with a font size of no less than 11. Abstracts can contain figures and tables within the 3-page limit.
- Both single- and co-authored papers are welcome, excluding papers co-authored with professors.
- The conference is aimed at **PhD students only**, so please do not apply if you have already been on the job market at the time of the conference.

Failure to comply with the requirements will result in your submission being automatically rejected.

Presentation or Poster:

We will ask you to specify whether you would like your project to be considered for the **presentation session** (20 minutes), the **poster session**, or both. If both options are selected, we will prioritise allocating a slot in the presentation session. Presenters are expected to serve as discussants for a fellow presenter's paper according to their field of research.

Deadline:

The deadline for submission is **31st January 2026** (Midnight GMT). Each applicant may only submit one application. If multiple abstracts are submitted by the same author, only the latest application will be evaluated. Applicants will be notified of the application outcome by **mid-March**.

Travel Reimbursements

We are able to reimburse participants for their travels to the conference. The reimbursements we can offer are capped at £150 for UK-based participants, £350 for attendees from EU and Schengen countries, and £750 for Overseas participants. We encourage attendees to use means of public transport where possible, we will not be able to reimburse any costs for taxis or related services.
