

Q1 What are the strengths and weaknesses of your teaching assistant (discussion section leader, lab section leader, grader, or other assistant) as an instructor, and how might his or her teaching be improved?

These were delivered well to my understanding. In addition the TA provided a lot of clarification on any doubts from the class and responded promptly to questions sent by email with relevant responses. Also, the TA drew our attention to other macro related programs such as the workshop on programming with continuous data which were very helpful.
