Job Description: The MPA in Economic Policy Management program out of Columbia University's School of International and Public Affairs is seeking a Student Assistant for the Spring and Summer sessions of 2023. The Student Assistant will work with our Student Services Coordinator on various projects throughout the semester, with a large focus on tasks to prepare for the incoming Summer class of 2023 and the many Summer events. Desired Skills:
